

MAIN POINTS FROM MEETING OF SOWERBY PARISH COUNCIL ON 10th JULY 2014

- Hambleton District Council's own dog warden service started start on 7th July.
- Hambleton District Council has received £6m from the Central Government Enterprise Partnership Local Growth Deal Fund. It has been allocated for road works in the North Northallerton area which will give some relief to the area close to the level crossing by providing a link between Darlington Road and Stokesley Road, crossing a beck and railway line. By 2026, development in that area will lead to the creation of 3,000 jobs and will bring in £320m of private sector investment.
- The B1448/A168 junction will be closed for a maximum of six months from early September whilst the new four way junction is created. Blakey Lane will also be closed for through traffic at the same time.
- The Council discussed future school provision as a result of the expansion of Sowerby.
- £100 was donated to help with the upkeep of the Skate Park.
- Some equipment in the Play Park will be out of use whilst repairs are undertaken.
- If Play Park users are unhappy with the behaviour of others in the vicinity they should contact the Police.
- There will be various events between August 3rd and 4th in Thirsk and Sowerby to remember the outbreak of war in 1914. Posters displayed around the neighbourhood.
- The next meeting of Sowerby Parish Council will be on September 11th 2014. NB. No meeting in August.
